Last Week's Meeting - April 4th

President David Lau welcomed Barry Goding, Kerry Goding, Kay Trembath, Barry Adams (Kay's partner, Alison Boyd, Trevor Boyd, Murray Hardinge and Kim Harbert ((Murray's partner) who were guests in relation to the Ron Goding Award.

He also welcomed Laurie McKee, twice a past president of Rotary Healesville and who was a close friend of Ron Goding.

David also noted that those on our 'sick list', Wilma and Graeme were recovering well. Rae Church added that Doug Symons had made a good 'hip recovery' in rehab, but had injured himself in a fall.

We all sang "Happy Birthday" to Chippy who blew out his own candle.

Youth: Michael Hardinge reported that the Speech Program was going well and would be up and running in 14 days.

Tony Jones reported that due to the inclement weather on Saturday, March 30th, the Races were cancelled. He thanked all who had turned up in spite of the weather conditions.

Community Service Laurence Webb sent a report re the Art Competition which will involve all of the Yarra Valley with the Respectful Relationships Program. By May, \$3000 will have been spent relating to Domestic Violence and a report will be given to the Board.

The SALT program will sponsor Years 9 & 10 from Healesville High School students with \$1000 for the Water Project.

Sam Halim mentioned that he had started to form a new committee for the Club, with new teams, in readiness for the new Rotary Year in June.

Ron Goding Excellence Award Recipient, Kay Trembath, proprietor of "Crumbz Craft" Main Street Healesville.

Eckhard Wellner opened the presentation stating that the Ron Goding award perpetuates Ron's memory and is presented to a business that we believe demonstrates the highest business and moral standards.

Rae Church was asked to speak of Ron Goding who owned a timber mill. Ron was a Rotary member from Alexander. When Rotary Healesville began in 1977, Ron guided the Club through its formative years. He travelled over the Black Spur to attend every meeting in Healesville, and in 8 years never missed a meeting. He loved to take an active part in Rotary projects. He helped move buildings to new locations, ran the Race Gates and attended to the parking for the Deb Balls. He constructed foot bridges and had a team of 'wood choppers' who collected and cut wood for those in need of assistance with wood fire heating during the winter. He provided materials for the timber related projects and was always the first to arrive at a project and the last to leave. Ron was a great Rotarian, a great friend and highly regarded by all.

Laurie McKee was President when the trophy was a burl from the side of a tree, which had been beautifully polished. Laurie carried the burl to the front of the room, in readiness to be presented by Murray Hardinge, last years recipient of the award to Kay. This perpetual trophy remains the repository for the name plates of the now 19 recipients of the award.

Eckhard told the story of 'Crumbz Craft'. Kay came to Healesville in 2011 and saw the need for a haberdashery

shop in our area – a shop that would sell gorgeous fabrics, inspiring yarns and unique handcrafts. Kay's inspiration came from her love of shopping and her dedication to craft-made gifts, guided by customer need.

Kay opened the shop in 2012 on the main street's high side, opposite the Post Office. "Crumbz Craft" has a wonderful team of talented staff, all of them accomplished crafters. The business continues to be built on customer need and over the years has become a hub, hosting regular craft events, knitting clubs, lessons and workshops. Kay sources high quality fabrics, yarns and designer patterns for her customers." Crumbz Craft" is a valuable attraction and resource both for our community and visitors.

Del Brown had nominated 'Crumbz Craft" for the award. She applied the criteria for her consideration based on Rotary's Four Way Test- truthfulness, fairness, goodwill and friendship with the belief that "Crumbz Craft" reflects those values and ethics in business dealings, and was deserving of the award. Del offered congratulations to Kay and her staff, mentioning that "Crumbz Craft" supports many local charities, and has extended this to raising funds for "Beyond Blue" and "Days for Girls" projects.

This year Kay is promoting "Cure Brain Cancer Foundation" whose logo is the crane, the bird that Japanese culture views as having curing powers. The logo has 5 colours. This year, to raise funds and promote awareness, flowers will be knitted or crocheted by volunteers using yarn provided by Kay. The flowers will be attached to a wire frame in the shape of a crane, and displayed in the shop front window. The created flowers will be sold and money raised will be donated to the "Cure Brain Cancer

Foundation".

Eckhart introduced Barry Goding a son of Ron, together with Barry's wife Kerry and invited them to come forward to very proudly present the award, a pastel drawing of a helmeted honey-eater near a banksia by Denise Smith a very talented local artist, together with a certificate.

Barry spoke of the joy of keeping his father's memory alive and found it a privilege that his Dad was acknowledged. He said that his father regarded service in business as the most important thing to give in a community, and that it was not about just making money. Having become a grandfather, 'Crumbz Craft' had facilitated a birth present of a jacket made by Barry's wife, who had never had the experience of creating such a gift. She was taught the skills and was provided with the materials – and Barry related, it was a rather expensive jacket by the time it was finished!

Murray Hardinge, last year's recipient, presented the perpetual Burl, to Kay

Kay Trembath graciously accepted the trophy and spoke of her business and thanked Rotary, saying it was an honour that her business had been recognised as deserving the award. She expressed appreciation of her staff, and mentioned that Allison taught children, ladies - and some gentlemen, the art of knitting. The team endeavours to meet community needs. Kay also thanked Barry, her partner for his support, especially in his role as 'maintenance' which involved everything from changing light bulbs to cleaning. She said that she was highly honoured to receive the Ron Goding Excellence Award.
